The Lieutenancy wants to celebrate this wonderful and personal expression by any member who has included the Order in their estate plans. To that end we have updated the Legacy Society Program. Here are key points of the new program:

Who qualifies to be a member of the NEW Legacy Society? – Anyone who includes the Order in their estate plan for any amount.

All members who include the Order in their Estate will be recognized as follows:

- *Recognition on their Annual Meeting Name Tag*
- *Recognition at the Annual Business Meeting*
- *Recognition at their Mid-Year Meeting*
- *It will be noted next to their name in the Annual Roster*
- *It will be noted in the Year in Review document*
- *Upon a member's passing the Lieutenant will speak to the impact of a member's gift at the Annual Meeting*

The three Legacy Society Achievement level have been updated. Member's obtaining these levels will receive an appropriate pin or brooch:

<i>Bronze -</i>	<i>\$25K to less than \$100K</i>
<i>Silver -</i>	<i>\$100K to less than \$250K</i>
<i>Gold -</i>	<i>\$250K and above</i>

For members who have already made an estate commitment and are members of the original Legacy Society Program you will be happy to know that your status and level will continue under the new program.
