Our Faithful Companion



When I was approached to provide an opening missive for an FTU, I was so very grateful it was for the month of May, the month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary. From my earliest days at St. Thaddeus Catholic Grade School in Joliet, Illinois, until these very days as a Roman Catholic Priest of the Archdiocese of Las Vegas, Mary has been a "Faithful Companion" of mine along the way.

I remember learning from my first-grade teacher, Sister Barbara Marie Brylka, CSSF, how young Mary was (about 14 or 15?) when the Archangel Gabriel shocked her with what seemed to be a nearly impossible proposition to become the Mother of Jesus, who is God, thereby making her the Mother of God! "How can this be..." (Luke 1:34) was the question Mary asked? The answer from the Archangel was "The Holy Spirit will come upon you...for nothing will be impossible for God" (Luke 1:35-37). Her iconic response, "May it be done to me


according to your word" (Luke 1:38) is the ultimate example of humility and trust for all of us as disciples of her most beloved Son, Jesus.

It was a little over 30 years ago, while I was a Conventual Franciscan Brother, that I felt the call to the ministerial priesthood. "How can this be?" was now my question, especially since I didn't think I could endure the necessary studies! It was Mary's humble example that allowed me to embrace her "fiat" as I put my trust in the call of her Son, the Good Shepherd.

With Mary as my "Faithful Companion," and through the intercession of St. Joseph of Cupertino (Patron saint of students and member of the Conventual Franciscan Friars), the next five years saw me completing my Bachelor of Arts degree in Religious Studies followed by earning my Master of Divinity degree, Cum Laude, of all things! I learned that "nothing will be impossible for God!" I was ordained to the Priesthood of Jesus Christ at the age of 37 on May 8, 1999, a quick 25 years ago!

Moving quickly ahead with Mary as my "Faithful Companion," I discerned my journey to embrace the diocesan Priesthood in the now Archdiocese of Las Vegas, where there was and still is such a need for priests. Arriving in Las Vegas in 2010, I was formally incardinated as a priest of the Archdiocese of Las Vegas in 2013. The rest is history. And so, appropriately in this month dedicated to "Mary, Mother of God," I give thanks to God for the gift of the Blessed Virgin Mary, such a "Faithful Companion" of ours along the way!


We begin our summer Rosary Speaker Series June 3rd at 6pm at St. Joseph, Husband of Mary Parish. See the MM&E section for details.




SPIRITUAL LEADERS... 5 WAYS YOU CAN LOVE MOTHER MARY. Based on an article written by




PILGRIMAGES SPONSORED BY THE LV COUNCIL....

Fr. Cam was born in a small village in Nigeria. He belongs to the Igbo tribe, which has the strongest Christian base in Nigeria.

After high school, he joined the Missionary Seminary of St. Paul of Nigeria and after nine years of training, he was ordained a Roman Catholic priest into the Missionaries of St. Paul (MSP) on June 25, 2005 by his Eminence, Lars Anders Cardinal Arborealism, OCD, Bishop of Stockholm.

He served as associate pastor for one year, after which he was posted to Botswana, where he learned the native Setswana language and served as pastor at two different parishes, until 2020.

After 13 years in Botswana, Father was sent to the United States for his second missionary journey – as parochial vicar at St. Anthony of Padua parish where he served for nearly two years before he was named parochial administrator of the parish.

Last July, we welcomed him to St. Joseph, Husband of Mary, where he now serves as pastor.

Fr. Cam's passion is to see all hearts inflamed with the love and power of the Holy Spirit through a reawakening of the Eucharistic devotion

FROM OUR ABOUNA BERNARD POGGI / RECTOR BEIT JALA SEMINARY...

Sir Joe and Lady Connie,

Greetings during this Easter Season, a season of joy and refreshment – Christ is Risen, he is truly Risen!

This period after Easter has been a very volatile period. On one hand we spent one week in the Church of the Holy Sepulcher praying both in the morning and in the afternoon. The Triduum was liturgically beautiful, but was sad because our people were not given permits to come attend the celebrations from the West Bank. In fact Palm Sunday saw the smallest crowds since COVID.

After Easter we went to Galilee, this had been a tradition for many years in the Seminary to do as the disciples did after the resurrection. There we spent time in the Holy Places, we visited our parish communities and we were able to spend some time in nature, which is always a source of refreshment for us. On Sunday the 7th and Monday the 8th, we were in the Basilica of the annunciation to celebrate the feast of the Blessed Mother. This year due to the feast being during Holy Week, it was transferred until after Divine Mercy Sunday.

Upon returning to the seminary things returned to normal, but then last Saturday, the bombs from Iran were overhead. We had to put in place our protocol, we woke all of the seminarians and sisters up in the middle of the night to take them to a safe area. We were thankful that it didn't last very long, and we were able to return to our rooms, though many remained sleepless.

In general, I think that God can bring some good out of every situation. In the midst of the bombings, there were so many who wrote and texted asking if we needed anything and to tell us that they are united in prayer. It is an incredible feeling to know that so many people care and are untied to us. In a special way I want to thank HE Margie Romano who texted me immediately after hearing of the bombings, and with her so many dear members of the Western Lieutenancy.

Know that we are praying hard, our resolve is strong and our mission is clear. We have to do the work of the Blessed Mother with the disciples before the resurrection – keeping hope alive, keeping faith fervent and keeping the needs of the community met. With brothers and sisters like you, this mission is possible. Please keep praying.



A MAN OF GOD...A MAN OF COUNTRY...COL. THOMAS PEARSON...

Our own Dame Debbie Barton, DCHS and Committee Leader (along with Sir David, KCHS) have an amazing and blessed Dad...at 99 we see his smiling and loving gaze at Mass weekly at St. Joseph's Husband of Mary. But, this week his AMAZING service to our country was made known throughout Las Vegas and all Nevada as he was to be honored on the special flight to Washington D.C. to recognize his fabulous accomplishments. It would take the whole FTU to delineate all he has done for the US and free world. The most impressive thing...is his love and commitment to God and family...below is a sliver of his awesomeness, we are proud to know him and grateful to God for the work he has done for the earthly freedom of mankind...



He retired after 29 years as a full Colonel, having entered the Army Air Corp in 1943; earned his wings at age 19 and began flying B-17's. At 19 he was already the FLIGHT COMMANDER with a crew of 10.


During WWII he flew the B-17 in Air and Sea RESCUE MISSIONS in the Pacific Theatre, off the coast of Japan, to search and rescue downed US pilots and crew members.

During the Korean War, just 5 years later, he was assigned to Barksdale AFB in LA where he and his crew flew numerous training and bombing missions in the US to maintain READINESS IN CASE the war in Korea escalated.

Colonel Pearson also flew a number of bombing runs as an IP (Instructor Pilot) in the B-52 over North Vietnam while assigned to a base in Thailand during

the VN war. Throughout his entire career, he served in SAC, the STRATEGIC AIR COMMAND, flying the B-17, B-25, B-47, and B-52, despite having wanted to be a fighter pilot.

ENGAGEMENT... MINUTE SPOTLIGHT... During the April Rosary, we were delighted to introduce you to Sir Terrance and Dame Elizabeth Barry. They have each held the rank of Grand Cross for more than



20 years and were awarded Palms by the Grand Magisterium in Rome in 2019. These honors were built on a foundation of having been in the Order since 1987.

This is a theme of theirs, that a strong foundation builds connections. For example, Terry and Betty, as they are fondly known, met in LA over 60 years ago. But they were invested at St. Theresa's in Maui and this is a special connection because Betty is originally from Maui. Terry meanwhile was born in Idaho, moved to Colorado then LA where he moved in with 2 other guys working for Pacific Mutual who knew two girls who knew Betty. Another connection.

In 1984, Betty and Terry together started the Barry Company, a family real estate business in Orange County where they raised 7 adult children. They maintain strong connections with all their children and their 10 grandchildren and 3 great-grandchildren. Since their Holy Land Pilgrimage 25 years ago, they have travelled all over, including Lourdes eight times because of connections to the Knights of Malta. Here's one last connection: on their visit to Ireland 2 years ago, they discovered Barry Castle. Even though it was closed for construction; they were allowed in and now plan to return to see it completed.

JUSTICE & PEACE...Cardinal Filoni, Grand Master of the EOHSJ recently said peace in the Holy Land requires a change of mentality, regardless of whether there is one state or two. The Vatican has long insisted on a two-state solution. His comments represent one of the first hints that at least some in Rome may be rethinking their stance.

Filoni stated the most important thing is to have "the rights of each one respected, without having citizens of first-class, second-class, third-class. A peace that is not just creates new wars, new hatred, new violence." He noted the Second World War broke out because citizens in Germany believed they were victims of injustice.

"When a people, a group, a reality, feels that they are the victim of injustice, if they are not listened to, it foments and hatred is born and grows and, at a certain point, becomes violent."


One of the main ways to promote peace is through education. He spoke about the schools in the Holy Land that the Order funds. 20,000 students are currently enrolled, around half are Muslim.

"We can teach peace from the base to young people, if we create a calm, respectful environment where we teach peace, mutual respect, and human rights (then) we are promoting peace" to both students and their parents.

"If we eradicate the concept of who is first-class, second-class, who has the divine right, then," peace would be easier.

The first and most important thing to work for, he said, is coexistence, "always in the right of all to live with justice and the recognition of everyone's rights, because if this is lacking, two states or three states, problems would exist."
